Cultivating Love Through Friendship




Jesus said, "....I have called you friends, for everything I learned from my Father, I have made known to you. - John 15:15

Concordia Lutheran Council Meeting Minutes

Reflecting God's love in service to all through our family of faith!

The monthly meeting of the Concordia Lutheran Council was held February 3rd, 2025 at approximately 5:30 pm in the church basement. Present were Peg Lutt, Grant Anderson, Mandy Bruning, Dustin Thompson, and Kenny Steinle.

We started the meeting reviewing the January 2025 Pastor's Report.

Next, Judy Martindale presented the monthly income for January 2025. We decided that council meetings will work on the 1st Mondy of each month as it will not affect any financial reports.

Soon after, Secretary Grant Anderson reported the minutes of the 2025 Annual Meeting. Everything looked good and minutes were approved.

Trisha Reifenrath was not present to report the Monthly Expenses. However, Council did agree to refund the former Parsonage tenant's, Grant Anderson, security deposit. After discussions, all financial reports were approved.

Our next topic was going over Council Goals for 2025. It was brought up that the Memorial/Gift Fund may have money to pay for the AED. Dustin suggested also purchasing the AED 'Premium Package' as it will include a LifeVac. This will cost roughly \$1709 in total. Although it is very simple to use, some members of Council were interested in doing a quick training to better familiarize themselves with the AED. Dustin is still hopeful that a grant will come through to pay for the AED premium kit, but Council made a motion to approve Dustin to just go ahead and purchase the kit however he best sees fit. This motion was approved along with approving the rest of the 2025 Goals.

Then, we reviewed some Old Business. The cost to replace the broken stain glass window will cost around \$500. We agreed not to turn in a claim as it is lower than our deductible. As for the lighting in the sanctuary, we are just waiting on Brad Harder to see if he is able to find and install a compatible bulb. Dustin also pointed out that if we drop the fixture down a few of those chain links, then it may be easier to get a bulb to fit.

Our next point of discussion was New Business. Council agreed that the 1st Monday of each month at 5:30 will work for Council Meetings. Peg agreed to do all sermons and children sermons while Pastor is gone in February/March. She would appreciate some volunteers to help read. Dustin agreed to be a liturgist 2/9 & 2/23. Grant agreed to be a liturgist 2/16. A Bishop from Omaha will be here for communion on 3/2. Lent kicks off on Ash Wednesday, March 5th. Council will serve lunch on March 19th and the WECLA will serve lunch on April 2nd.

After closing out New Business, we discussed how we would like to disperse our Lent Offerings. A motion was set forth to donate this money to Lutheran Family Services. This motion was approved.

Then, the 140-year Anniversary of our Church is approaching in May. We briefly discussed how we would like to celebrate. We will make more concrete plans in the coming months.

Last, we further discussed the three boys who applied as tenants to the Church Parsonage. Peg passed out applications of the three tenants for Council Members to review. After discussion, Council agreed to present a lease agreement to the boys with special conditions. Rent will be \$900/month, each tenant must show proof of a Renter's Insurance Policy with at least \$500,000 of liability before move in, the dwelling should not house more than three tenants or anyone who has not signed the lease. It should also be known that they are representing a church property and that everything should be in order and well kept. If the tenants do not abide by the lease agreement, we can evict them. We designated Kenny Steinle to be the main point of contact for

these tenants. We gave Kenny the ability to negotiate rent down to no less than \$700/month without Council approval if the boys do not accept \$900/month.

Meeting is adjourned.
